Sorichoom is the dance team that plays Korean traditional dance with percussion instruments such as Janggu(snare drum), Book(Bass drum),So-go(small snare drum), Jing(large gong) and Kwaenggwari(small flat gong). Sou yeon Nam, the leader of Sorichoom not



only wants to deliver the Korean culture and arts through the performance but also pursues to integrate the Korean culture into the multiculturalism of Vancouver. Beginning with the invitation of the St. Andrew Kim Parish in 2014, the Sorichoom performed Sul Jang-gu dance and So-go dance in BC Christian Academy, Kamloops festival, PNE festival, and BC Catholic School Conference Opening at Vancouver Convention Center.

Since 2011, YoungJoo Kim has been performing as one of the Korean Traditional Dance representatives of Vancouver. After years of preparation and training other artists, she has been presenting CCADS to Vancouver's performing arts community.

*YEON-HEE-MU

YEONHEEMU is an artistic Korean dance form performed using the understatement of highly formalized set steps and gestures. Sou Yeon choreographed YEONHEEMU for an auspicious occasion to celebrate happiness with the Korean traditional dance style of graceful and sinuous movement.

*CHUK-WON-MU

This dance offered to the deity with wishes for goodness to be bestowed on the people The ritual function of CHUKWON-MU relies mainly on sympathizing with and connecting to the deity and praising the deity with music and dance. This dance delivers a message of blessing to the people.

*JANGGU DRUM DANCE

By an elegant janggu drum dance and delightful sul-janggu, a collaboration of percussions.

*SO-GO-CHUM

SOGOCHUM is one of the Korean traditional dances performed using So-Go, a small drum, to express the wish for a bountiful harvest and prosperity.

*LIVING DRUMS

The Dance of the Living Drums is composed with the unique rhythms from Korean traditional music, showing the harmony of the classical percussion and the dancers' movements.

PROGRAM 'K - THE SCENT OF GUGAK' CONCERT

CHUN-NYEON MANSE GAYAGEUM: AHRAM KIM, PIRI: SEUNGHO KANG, DAEGEUM: SUNGWOO KANG 'Chun-nyeon Manse' means Royal court bouquet music to pray for a long life. Today we're going to play a small chamber music.

GAYAGEUM SANJO ------ GAYAGEUM: OKJOO YOON JANGDAN: SUNGWOO KANG 'Gayageum Sanjo' is a Gayageum solo repertoire that shows the beautiful tone of Gayageum and the performer's artistic skills.

CHUNG SUNG GOK DAEGEUM: SUNGWOO KANG 'Chungsung gok' is a representative Daegeum solo repertoire that touches the heart with the clear tone of Daegeum and the deep breathing of the performer.

25-STRING GAYAGEUM DUO ------ **25-STRING GAYAGEUM: OKJOO YOON, AHRAM KIM** The 25-string Gayageum is a musical instrument that developed traditional Gayageum and is widely played these days. Today, Duo will play a medley of songs by Johan Pachelbel's Canon, folk song of Indonesian Java island and masterpieces of the Beatles.

FRONTIER ------ COMPOSER : BANG-EAN YANG 'Frontier' was selected as the official theme song of the Busan Asian Games in 2002, and is a representative fusion music

that combines Korean traditional music, piano, and orchestra.
THE CHILDREN OF SANCHEZ OST ------ TAEPYEONGSO SOLO: SEUNGHO KANG

'The Children of Sanchez' theme music of the movie plays Taepyeongso instead of Flugelhorn. Taepyeongso is the wind instrument with the highest pitch and the loudest volume among Korean traditional instruments.

HUENGBO-GA BAK-TARYEONG PANSORI SOLO: HYUNJUNG PARK 'Huenboga' tells the story of Heungbo and Nolbo brothers, and teaches them that good life brings good luck. Today, she sings the part where good Heungbo becomes very rich with gold and silver treasures and rice from gourds.

THE SPRING OF MY HOMETOWN

'The spring of my hometown' is a children's song that Koreans love the most.

DYNAMITE BYBTS

'Dynamite' is a BTS song that topped the Billboard chart and gaining huge popularity all over the world.

FATE BYSUN-HEE LEE ------- SINGER: HYUNJUNG PARK

Fate is a mournful song about missing a lover.

ARIRANG MEDLEY

'Arirang' is representative folk song of Korea and various Arirang songs such as Gyeonggi Arirang – Miryang Arirang – Gangwon Arirang – Jindo Arirang are still sung. Today, we are going to sing a medley of these Arirang songs.

K-the scent of Gugak is a Korean traditional music group that plays various kinds of music based on Korean traditional music. Most of the members have received Korean traditional music education at the National Gugak Professional School since childhood and are actively performing in various art fields. This performance will showcase the essence of Korean traditional music and also try to take a step closer to the audience by playing the music widely known today with Korean traditional instruments. We arrange the music and perform it on stage in concert, but it is the audience who finally completes this performance. 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
